



# NEPAL

## A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY FOR PRIMARY AND SECONDARY TEACHERS

The country of Nepal has fascinated and attracted adventurers and travellers for decades with mysterious ancient cultures hidden in the remote valleys of the Himalayas. Having some of the world's most challenging and beautiful terrain, the country has become a major tourist destination for people attracted to the stunning mountains.

In this beautiful setting, the **International Nepal Fellowship [INF]** manages a small educational facility for expatriate children. The **Pokhara Study Centre [PSC]** has a rich heritage, having been started by INF in the early 1950's. Today, some of its students are returning to work in Nepal.

The kingdom of Nepal had been closed to outsiders for almost 150 yrs. After the country opened its borders to foreigners in the 1950's, the International Nepal Fellowship was granted permission by the King of Nepal to start the first medical work outside the Kathmandu Valley in the area of Pokhara. The formation of PSC soon followed to help with the education of the children of INF workers who came to serve here.



**We are currently recruiting primary and secondary school teachers** who would be interested in joining a team aimed at developing the programme even further.

Presently, PSC is the only educational facility outside the Kathmandu Valley offering an international curriculum. This is an important factor in enabling parents with international level expertise to live outside the Kathmandu Valley and be closer to the people who most need their professional skills.

INF's vision for **PSC** is to offer high quality, internationally recognized education with a strong Christian foundation following the example of other international schools in Asia. This goal is aimed at serving not only the mission community in the Pokhara Valley but also expat families in the region wanting international curricula education.

**PSC** is located on the outskirts of Pokhara, Nepal's third largest city, which is considered one of the most desirable places to live in the country. Pokhara is the gateway to the Annapurna range of the Himalayas for trekkers and mountain climbers and is a hub of activity for Nepal's booming tourist industry. The area has a multitude of outdoor activities including that attract tourists from around the world.

There are presently two open positions, effective immediately. Official visas were made available in December 2016 by the Government of Nepal for these positions.
